Ms Margaret Suen is currently the Cluster Coordinator on Medical Social Service in Kowloon West Cluster and Department Manager (MSS) in Caritas Medical Centre; a Central Committee (Palliative Care) member of Hospital Authority. She received her undergraduate training in the University of Windsor (Canada) in both social work and psychology, completed her master degree education in the University of New South Wales (Australia). With her clinical interest in palliative care, she completed the certificate training in Palliative Medicine from the University of Cardiff (UK) and in 2011, she became a Fellow in Thanatology. She participates in the teaching work as honorable lecturer and field placement supervisor in the Department of Social Work & Social Administration in Hong Kong University, and serves as the Advisory Committee member in the Department of Social Work in the Chinese University of Hong Kong. She was awarded the Hong Kong Outstanding Social Worker of the year in 2011.

Mr. Ivan Fung is a registered social worker. He is now a lecturer at The Nethersole School of Nursing, focusing on gerontological education.

Ms. Faith Liu works as a Nurse Consultant (End-of-Life Care) in The Hong Kong Association of Gerontology. Her publication and research topics includes cancer pain; community palliative care in Hong Kong; preparing cancer patients to die at home; health problems encountered by dying patients receiving palliative home care and Advance Care Planning.
